→Koehler's Korner→



This month we will look at an issue I ran into at an annual a few months ago. We were working on a Cessna 182 with a Continental O-470 engine. The engine had been warmed

up and we were removing the top spark plugs for a compression check. I looked down into



the spark plug recess in the top of the #3 cylinder (middle on right side) and spotted a washer on its side. I glanced at the recently removed plug and noted it did not have a washer on it. The gasket that was next to the spark plug hole is pictured below.



The gasket was distorted in a very strange fashion. Spark plug gasket washers are made of soft copper and are designed to slightly deform to completely seal the plug to the cylinder. We will talk later about proper installation of the spark plug. Turning over the found gasket showed even more odd marking on it as seen in the next picture:



For comparison I got a fresh used gasket as shown in the next picture. Obviously the found gasket had not been installed correctly. In fact, using an old spark plug allowed me to finally figure out what had happened.

It turns out that the best scenario we could come with is as follows. At the last annual, a year ago, the person installing the top spark plugs after the compression check allowed the gasket to fall off and sit sideways in the recess for the top spark plug in the midst of all the cylinder cooling fins. Not noticing the washer was off, the installer routinely started the plug with fingers and then properly tightened the plug with a torque wrench. The

plug pinched the gasket and swaged it under part of the plug flange. The rest of the gasket bent and formed around the plug.



The amazing thing about this incident is that the spark plug worked correctly for about 90 flight hours since the last annual. There was absolutely no gas leakage and no damage to the spark plug hole. And, obviously, the plug functioned correctly.

Let's at this point review the proper procedures for installing spark plugs and their the manufacturers Most of recommend replacing the spark plug gasket every time you install the plug. Spruce sells them for about \$.70 a piece, which, in the grand scheme of things, is really not very much. The 182 would cost about \$16.40 for all new washers. However, there are several folks that advocate reusing old gaskets, but annealing them with a propane torch to rejuvenate them. You can find examples of how to do this on the internet, but basically, you heat the washer to cherry red, and then let it slowly cool to room temperature. This will leave the gasket soft and pliable and able to conform to the small imperfections in cylinder heads and spark plug flanges. The argument is that once a gasket is used and the plug torqued against it, it begins to become more brittle, which, if allowed to persist, will cause the gasket to eventually crack and fail.

After some 35 years of working on GA aircraft I have found that spark plug gaskets are readily reusable without annealing, provided you install the plug with proper anti-seize and use a proper torque wrench. If tightened with a good torque wrench, the gaskets do not embrittle and can be reused for the life of the plug. On most Lycomings, the spark plug torque is 30 to 35 foot-pounds, and on most Continentals it is 25 to 30 foot-pounds. I use a Craftsman bending beam type torque wrench, which takes some technique, but never goes out of calibration, whereas the currently popular click-type torque wrenches are notorious for being grossly out of limits. Be sure your click type is regularly sent in for calibration and is kept in a clean environment, not bouncing around in the bottom of your toolbox. I torque to a pound over the lower limit and have never had a problem removing such a plug. If you torque by the armstrong method, standby for problems. If you overtorque and mess up the spark plug hole, you run a high possibility of having to pull the cvlinder!

Hope this little discussion helps you more successfully maintain your engine and the parts on it.
